BIENNIAL CLOVER

Red Clover is a biennial clover that has hollow, hairy stems and branches. The flower on this clover is a rose-pink color and is borne in compact clusters. It is primarily used for hay, silage, and soil improvement. **Red Clover** is easily established and fast growing. It produces high quality forage, which makes it a good choice to add in pasture grass mixtures for grazing cattle and other animals. It can be used to increase soil fertility through its nitrogen fixation. This clover grows best on well-drained loamy soils.

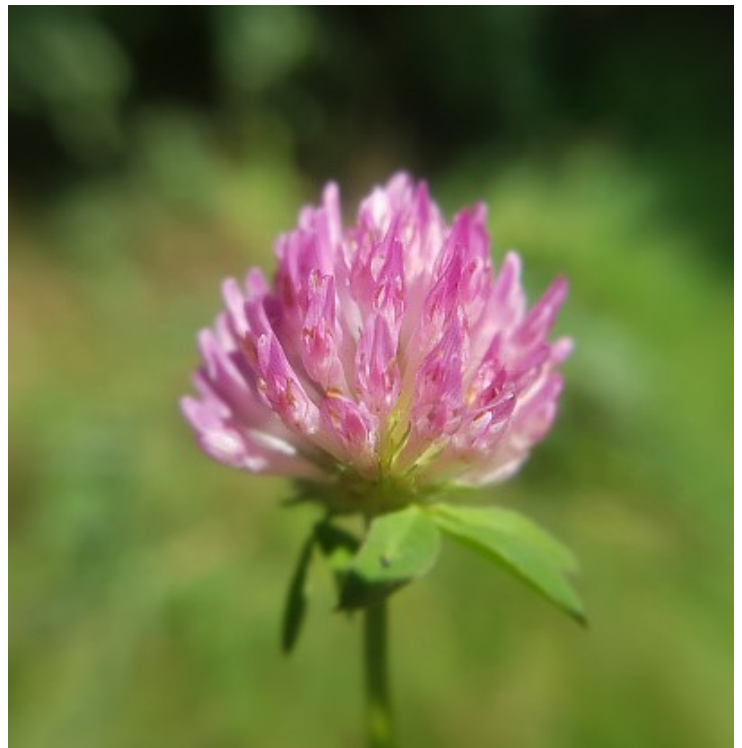
PLANTING TIPS

- ◆ Plant seeds 1/4 to 1/2 inch deep
- ◆ Graze or cut for hay when clover is 1/4 to 1/2 in bloom
- ◆ Second cuttings should occur when clover is 1/4 in bloom
- ◆ Leave 2-3 inches of growth after each harvest
- ◆ Keep lime and fertilizers at proper levels
